An Iconic Timeline

AIRSTREAM HISTORY IS RICH WITH INNOVATION AND THE SPIRIT OF ADVENTURE

1930s

Airstream founder Wally Byam builds his first travel trailers. He sells templates for others to make their own and soon pivots to opening the first Airstream factory in California. Travel trailers boom, then bust during the war. Wally has to close his first factory.





1940s

During WWII, Wally finds employment in the aviation industry. By war's end, he works as a certified manufacturing engineer at Curtis Wright Industries, where he eventually manufactures a line of aluminum travel trailers similar to the prewar Airstream Clipper. By spring of 1947 he leaves Curtis Wright and restarts Airstream




1950s

Wally begins testing his travel trailers on Caravans that criss-cross the globe, and in 1955 the Wally Byam Caravan Club International is founded to continue inspiring international goodwill and lifelong friendships. In 1958, the International package hits the market, allowing owners to travel without the need for shore power or water hookups.



After battling cancer, Wally passes away in 1962. His colleagues carry on his legacy, refining Airstreams with internal facelifts as well as exterior and structural changes. When humans first visit the moon in 1969, an Airstream is used as a Mobile Quarantine Facility for the astronauts upon their return to Earth.







1970s

Airstream enters the motorized world with the Argosy motorhome. To consolidate operations during the 1970s' recession, Airstream moves all manufacturing to Jackson Center, Ohio, which becomes the official headquarters.



1980s

An Airstream Caravan makes history by traveling through China for the first time. On August 29, 1980, Wade Thompson and Peter Orthwein acquire Airstream and simultaneously form a new company, THOR Industries, Inc. Under their leadership, Airstream enters a fresh season of business.





1990s

Interest in vintage Airstreams begins to grow, resulting in the creation of the Vintage Airstream Club, a chapter of the Wally Byam Caravan Club International. Airstream introduces several lightweight travel trailers that can be towed by the smaller tow vehicles of the era.



2000s

Airstream begins a long-running collaboration with Mercedes-Benz® on all of its Class B touring coaches. The touring coaches are built on a Mercedes-Benz chassis, and every single safety, comfort, and convenience option is offered as standard.



2010s

Airstream reintroduces its 16foot Basecamp design with
new features and improved
engineering. The rugged
Basecamp X and a 20-foot
Basecamp soon follow. Smart
Control Technology provides
owners with an unprecedented
level of digital insights and remote
control of their Airstream.



2020s

Airstream headquarters expands with a brand new 750,000-square-foot factory, which includes a Heritage Center for Airstream lovers to visit and be part of. Airstream celebrates its 90th anniversary in 2021.







Wally Byam

Airstream founder Wally Byam was an inventor, a creator, and most of all a dreamer. Sixty years after his death, his spirit for adventure lives on in every Airstreamer, and the philosophy he captured in his poetic Creed continues to inspire us to see what's over the next hill.

"In the heart of these words is an entire life's dream. To those of you who find in the promise of these words your promise, I bequeath this creed...my dream belongs to you.

"To place the great wide world at your doorstep for you who yearn to travel with all the comforts of home.

"To provide a more satisfying, meaningful way of travel that offers complete travel independence, wherever and whenever you choose to go or stay.

"To keep alive and make real an enduring promise of high adventure and faraway lands... of rediscovering old places and new interests.

"To open a whole world of new experiences...a new dimension in enjoyment where travel adventure and good fellowship are your constant companions. "To encourage clubs and rallies that provide an endless source of friendships, travel fun, and personal expressions.

"To lead caravans wherever the four winds blow...over twinkling boulevards, across trackless deserts...to the traveled and untraveled corners of the earth.

"To play some part in promoting international goodwill and understanding among the peoples of the world through person-to-person contact.

"To refine and perfect our product by continuous traveltesting over the highways and byways of the world.

"To strive endlessly to stir the venturesome spirit that moves you to follow a rainbow to its end...and thus make your travel dreams come true."



GETTING STARTED

Glossary of Common Terms

Airstreamer: More than just campers or travelers, Airstream owners are a unique band of wanderers and wonderers tied together by our mutual love of iconic design, expert craftsmanship, and endless adventures.

Aluminum: Since the Airstream Clipper hit the market in 1936, Airstream has constructed recreational vehicles from sheets of this strong but highly pliable material.

Waste, Gray, and Fresh Water Tanks: Most Airstreams are equipped with three holding tanks. The gray tank holds all liquids that go down the sink drains, the fresh tank holds several dozen gallons of fresh water, and the waste tank holds solid and liquid waste that goes down the toilet.

Boondocking: Camping off-grid without the typical hookups available at a campsite.

Caravan: From informal groups of Airstreamers traveling together to organized adventures conducted by the Airstream Club International (aka The Wally Byam Caravan Club International), Caravans strengthen the bonds between travelers while inspiring new adventures.

Coupler: Your Airstream travel trailer features a chassis that tapers into an A-frame at the front, and the coupler is the rounded end of that A-frame. The coupler is lowered onto the hitch ball and secured for towing.











Curbside: Equivalent to the passenger side of an automobile. The curbside features an awning and the main entry door.

GVWR: Gross Vehicle Weight Rating is the maximum amount of weight that your travel trailer should not exceed. The GVWR includes the weight of the trailer itself, plus any gear, equipment, food, and other items you pack for your trip.

Hitch: The welded support bar on the back of your tow vehicle. The hitch features a receiver tube into which you insert a ball mount and secure with a hitch pin for safety.

Hitch Ball: The metal ball onto which the travel trailer's coupler will attach.

Rivet: Airstream's iconic travel trailers feature a shell of aluminum sheets riveted together. Rivets have been used since ancient times to fasten sheets of metal, in a process that hammers one end of the rivet down so it tightly pinches the two pieces together.

Semi-Monocoque: An airplane fuselage is a monocoque ("monoh-cock") body formed from a circular tube. An Airstream's riveted aluminum shell is considered semi-monocoque because it's fastened to a sheet of composite flooring. These types of structures are some of the most structurally sound vehicle shapes.

Streetside: Equivalent to the driver's side of an automobile. An Airstream's streetside is where you'll find electrical, water, and sewer hookups.

The Mothership: Airstream's world headquarters in Jackson Center, Ohio. Since 1980, all Airstreams have been born at The Mothership, and a visit is on many Airstreamer bucket lists.

Tongue: The tapering A-frame of the chassis is referred to as the tongue. Your hitch has a tongue weight rating that should never be exceeded.

Wally Byam: Born on the Fourth of July in 1896, Wally Byam founded Airstream in 1931 with the promise of giving travelers all the comforts of home while they explore the world.

Weight Distribution: Safe towing of a travel trailer requires following all weight recommendations and not overloading the front or rear of the unit. Many Airstreamers add a weight distribution hitch to their towing setup for extra safety.

Winterize: If you live in a northern climate where temperatures drop below freezing, your Airstream should be winterized to prevent damage. The process involves blowing water out of the plumbing and/or adding non-toxic RV antifreeze to prevent freezing pipes.

Work from Anywhere: While any Airstream model can double as a mobile home office, we also manufacture several travel trailers equipped with connectivity solutions, desks, and dedicated workspaces that make it easier to work from the road.





What Do the Red Numbers Mean?

Have you ever seen an Airstream with big red numbers on its front? Here's their story. In 1951, Airstream founder, Wally Byam, set out to lead a Caravan of 63 Airstreams (and their adventurous owners) throughout Central America. His second cousin Dale "PeeWee" was along for the ride. There were, of course, no cell phones or GPS to help keep track of everyone, so Wally assigned big red numbers to each Airstream. Wally and Stella's Airstream was number 1 and led the pack. Ever since then, the Club has assigned the same kind of numbers to their members—some of whom display them in the same original style.

Camping 101

Campgrounds are an essential part of the Airstreaming experience. But booking a site, setting up camp, and hooking up to electric, water, and sewer can be overwhelming for the first-timer. With a little preparation and a willingness to learn, navigating campgrounds will quickly become second nature.


Types of Campsites:

Full Hookup

Full hookup sites come with water, electricity, and sewer hookups. By far the most popular, these sites are often booked well in advance.

Partial Hookup

These types of sites are the most commonly available. In general, a partial hookup site will offer electricity from a pedestal located near a rectangular concrete pad.







Private, Park, or Public Land: Understanding Different Campground Options

Different types of campgrounds offer vastly different experiences. Private campgrounds (like KOA, Thousand Trails, or the smaller independent spots) often provide a wide range of amenities—from beachfront access to sprawling pools, golf courses, and close-by location to popular attractions. State parks can vary widely from state to state, but can be less expensive and are usually well-situated in the natural world. National parks are popular and often difficult to reserve, but put you at the epicenter of the some of the best outdoor sightseeing and activities available. And while public land means boondocking without electric, water, and sewer hookups, the challenge of boondocking more than makes up for the solace, serenity, and escape you find far from the crowds.

It's also known as dry camping, dispersed camping, public land camping, primitive camping, wild camping, and free camping. 
Where to Boondock

The best resource for finding great boondocking spots is often the Airstream community online. Popular camping websites and apps can be helpful as well.



What to Bring

Since you won't be hooking up to power or water at camp, you'll need to bring your resources along with you. That includes refillable fresh water bladders and/or jugs, extra food, power banks, solar panels, and emergency and communication gear.


